Compliance Status

This website is **partially compliant** with the accessibility requirements established by the applicable legislation and technical standards due to certain remaining non-conformities and/or technical limitations that are currently being progressively addressed.

FAST MILANO S.P.A. has initiated and continues to carry out analysis, assessment, updating, and technical improvement activities aimed at progressively increasing the accessibility of the website's content and functionalities.

Any remaining limitations do not currently prevent users from accessing the website's principal information and digital services in a substantial manner.

Content and Functionalities That May Not Be Fully Accessible

Despite the ongoing accessibility improvements, certain sections of the website may still present partial limitations with respect to the requirements established by the UNI CEI EN 301549 standard and the WCAG 2.1 Level AA guidelines.

C.9.1.4.1 – Colour may occasionally be used as the sole visual means of conveying information, indicating actions, or distinguishing interface elements.

C.9.1.4.3 – Certain textual content and graphical components may not fully satisfy the minimum colour contrast requirements established by the applicable accessibility standards.

C.9.2.1.1 – Some functionalities or interactive components may not be completely operable using only a keyboard or equivalent input devices.

C.9.2.4.3 – On certain pages, the keyboard focus order may not always follow the logical or functional sequence of the content.

C.9.2.4.4 – The purpose of certain hyperlinks may not be immediately understandable from the link text alone or from its surrounding context.

C.9.2.4.7 – The visual focus indicator may not always be present or clearly visible on certain interactive elements.

C.9.3.1.2 – The language of certain portions of the content may not be correctly identified within the source code.

C.9.3.2.2 – Certain context changes may occur automatically following interaction with specific user interface components without prior notification to the user.

C.9.3.3.1 – Certain errors occurring in forms or input fields may not be identified or described in a fully accessible manner.

C.9.3.3.2 – Certain labels, instructions, or guidance associated with form fields may not be fully compliant with accessibility requirements.

FAST MILANO S.P.A. continuously carries out monitoring, technical assessments, and progressive accessibility improvements, including ongoing updates to the website platform and its underlying technological components.
